Report of inaugural

Sangam: Festival of India in Sri Lanka, 2015-2016 was inaugurated in Colombo on November 19, 2015. The inaugural event, a mosaic of Indian dance forms, "Nrityarupa", was held at the iconic Nelum Pokuna theatre.
