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Art historian Annapurna Garimella explores one of India's preeminent living modernists, Madhvi Parekh, and her sustained engagement with the figure of Christ. Focussing on her massive 2011 reverse acrylic painting, *The Last Supper*, Garimella examines the meaning of Christ, the importance of art history and the aesthetics and materiality of the reverse acrylic painting technique for the making of one of Parekh's most significant works. She situates this painting both in the long history of the artist's oeuvre, the importance of the Last Supper as a subject in the history of art and the significance of Christ as a source of inspiration for modern Indian artists since the 20th century.
