Bhattacharyya (1924-1997)
was a renowned poet, playwright, translator, editor and
literary organizer, who was
the first and the only president of the Sahitya Akademi
from the Northeast. He was
one of the pioneers of modern Assamese literature and

the first ever Assamese writer to receive the Jnanpith Award in 1979 for his novel Mrityunjay.

Bhattacharyya earned the respect of the entire Assamese modern literary sphere for playing a very crucial torch-bearer's role in discovering, nurturing and promot-

ing young literary talents in Assam from the 1960s as the editor of the historic Assamese literary journal Ramdhenu. He served as the president of the Asam Sahitya Sabha during 1983-1985 and was the recipient of the Sahitya Akademi Award for his novel Iyaruingam.
